1.0 Membership Fees

1.1 REN-ISAC financial principles are described in the Charter.

1.2 To provide for long-term sustainability and to support growth of services and membership, a modest annual membership fee is charged. The fee is per institution, regardless of the number of member representatives. The scope of "institution" when applied to multi-campus systems is described in section 3.2 of the Membership Terms and Conditions.

1.3 For colleges and universities in the United States, fees are calculated according to a modified Carnegie Classification (CC) model, based on the CC Basic2015 of U.S. colleges and universities. The 30+ CC classes are mapped to 4 REN-ISAC classes using Table A below.

Table A. Fee Assessment for Colleges / Universities in the United States

Carnegie Classification (BASIC 2015)	REN-ISAC Membership Fee (Annual)
Doctoral Universities: Highest Research Activity	\$2,500
Doctoral Universities: High Research Activity	\$2,250
Doctoral Universities: Moderate Research Activity Master's Colleges & Universities: Larger Programs	\$1,500
All Other Carnegie Classifications	\$1,250

Colleges and universities outside the United States are assessed based on student enrollment (full, part-time, and graduate combined), using Table B below.

Table B. Fee Assessment for Colleges / Universities in the Australia, Canada, New Zealand, and UK

Enrollment Range	Description	REN-ISAC Membership Fee (Annual)
25,001 or more	Very High Enrollment	\$2,500
10,001 to 25,000	High Enrollment	\$2,250
2,501 to 10,000	Medium Enrollment	\$1,500
1 to 2,500	Small Enrollment	\$1,250

All other institutions are assessed according to the primary activity in which those institutions are engaged, using table C.

Table C. Fee Assessment for Non-Degree-Granting Institutions

Primary Activity	REN-ISAC Membership Fee (Annual)
Medical Centers / Teaching Hospitals	\$2,250
Research & Education Networks, Research Centers, University Administration/Governance and Departments	\$1,500
Consortia*	\$1,250

* In most cases, each institution in the consortium is assessed a membership fee

- 1.4 Annually, billing for the coming FY occurs in May, with payment due by August 1.
- 1.5 New members receive pro-rated invoices for the FY in which they join.
- 1.6 The fees will be re-evaluated each year, and communicated to members no later than September 30.
